#### 1973

On August 30, 1973, forty-four (44) ladies representing sixteen (16) states met in Hotel Fort Des Moines, Des Moines, Iowa, to discuss the possibility of forming a national auxiliary to EANGUS. Following much discussion it was voted to form a national auxiliary. The temporary officers elected were President, Mary McKamey, LA; Vice President, Doris Williams, MS; Secretary, Dot Brown, MS. The following year was spent working on a constitution and bylaws.

The purpose of the EANGUS Auxiliary is to support EANGUS in all of its endeavors. Membership will be by membership in state auxiliaries. Only spouses of enlisted members of state enlisted associations belonging to EANGUS can become members of the EANGUS Auxiliary.

#### 1974

The first organization meeting of the EANGUS Auxiliary was held October 1, 1974 in the Gulf Room of the Biloxi-Sheraton Motor Inn in Biloxi, MS. Acting Temporary President, Doris Williams, MS, conducted the business sessions. Constitution and Bylaws Chairman, Doris Poulsen, MD, presented the constitution and bylaws, which were accepted.

At the third business session on October 3rd, the executive council was formed. Officers elected for the 1974-1976 terms were President, Doris Williams, MS; Vice President, June O'Dowd, LA; Secretary, Murlene Webb, AR; and Treasurer, Rita Dekowski, MD. Area Directors elected by their respective areas were:

Area II—Marie Higgins, KY, Air, one year; Betty Lockard, MD, Army, two years

Area IV—Dianne Sullivan, MS, Air, one year; Pat Franke, LA, Army, two years

Area V-Irene Spencer, SD, Air, two years; Susan Peterson, NE, Army, one year

Area VI-Glendoris Miller, CO, Army, two years; no one elected for Air

Areas I, III, and VII had no report.

There were 11 states with organized auxiliaries as follows: Arkansas, Colorado, South Dakota, Kentucky, Mississippi, Missouri, Washington, Montana, Maryland, Nebraska and Louisiana.

## 1975

The EANGUS Auxiliary held its Second Annual Conference August 25-28, 1975 at the Imperial House Motel, Canton, Ohio. President Doris Williams, Mississippi, conducted the business sessions.

Alabama, Arizona, Kansas, North Carolina and Ohio were added to the list of states with organized auxiliaries. Doris Williams presented certificates of charter with the EANGUS Auxiliary to Arkansas, Arizona, Colorado, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, South Dakota, Washington, and Ohio. The total membership was 540.

Pendants and necklaces with the EANGUS seal would be a continuing money making project.

Area Directors elected were Area II - Doris Poulsen, MD (Air) two years; Area IV - Carol Souteau, MO (Air) two years; Area V - Susan Peterson, NE (Army) two years; Area VI - Caryl Spears, AZ (Air) two years. ## 1976

The Third Annual EANGUS Auxiliary Conference was called to order by President Doris Williams, Mississippi, on September 27, 1976 at the Continental Inn, Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Due to the resignation of Secretary Murlene Webb, Doris Poulsen, MD, was appointed to complete the term of office.

Thirteen chartered states answered roll call. Seven additional states were chartered since last year. They were Maine, Iowa, Washington DC, Georgia, North Carolina, Delaware and Pennsylvania. Membership was 901 as of June 30, 1976. Doris Parker was made an honorary member of the EANGUS Auxiliary.

#### 1977

The Regency Inn, Denver, Colorado, was the site for the Fourth Annual Conference of the EANGUS Auxiliary. President June O'Dowd, LA, conducted the business sessions from September 18-21, 1977, with 23 states chartered.

Wyoming, Massachusetts and Virginia received their charters. Membership was 1,248.

The membership voted to establish a scholarship fund, and a scholarship committee would set the requirements.

#### 1978

On March 3, 1978, the Executive Board of EANGUS Auxiliary approved an emblem for the Auxiliary. It shows the minuteman and lady standing together with the name of our organization spelled out in a circle around the figures.

March 17, 1978, President June O'Dowd, Louisiana, resigned her office. The Vice President, Lois Goodson, Ohio, then assumed the office of the President. Sara Hendricks, Iowa, was appointed by the Executive Board to fill the unexpired term of Vice President.

#### 1978

President Lois Goodson, Ohio, called the Fifth Annual EANGUS Auxiliary Conference to order at the Princess Kaiulani Hotel in Honolulu, Hawaii, on September 26, 1978. With the addition of Tennessee, there were 24 states chartered with a total membership of 1,394 as of June 30, 1978. The Ways and Means project for the year was a cash raffle for \$300.00. Cindy Wise of Kokomo, Indiana was the winner. About \$1,000.00 was cleared on the project.

Eleven applications were received for the scholarship awards. The Scholarship Committee set the requirements that an applicant must be the son, daughter or spouse of an EANGUS Auxiliary member and must have a letter of endorsement from their State's Auxiliary President. Other qualifications were listed on the application forms. The winners of the \$300.00 scholarship were Francis Wyatt, Iowa; Kim Poulsen, Maryland; Paul Burgess, Iowa; Karrie Hendricks, Iowa; Judith McDonald, Pennsylvania. The membership voted to use \$1,500.00 again for the scholarships for the coming year.

The election of officers for the 1978-1980 term was held. Officers elected were: President-Lois Goodson, OH; Vice President-Sara Hendricks, IA; Secretary-Beverly Arn, OH; and Treasurer-Rita Dekowski, MD. Doris Williams, Past President, held an impressive installation service for the Officers and Area Directors. Area Directors elected by their respective areas were: Area I-Carol Gillooly, MA (Army) 1 year; Area II-Joan Lee, VA (Army) 2 years; Area III-Julia Dildine, TN (Army) 1 year; Helen Tucker, GA (Air) 2 years; Area IV-Delores Ford, MS (Army) 2 years; Area V-Delores Hegge, SD (Air) 2 years; Area VI-Dolfe Van Alyne, WY (Army) 2 years; Caryl Spears, AZ (Air) 1 year; Area VII-Barbara Sharp, WA (Army) 2 years; Arvena Trout, WA (Air) 1 year.

The membership voted to send a telegram to President Carter urging him to sign the Survivors Benefit Bill. John Ball, President of EANGUS; SGM Donald Ingram, Senior Enlisted Advisor, ARNG; CMSgt Lynn Alexander, Senior Enlisted Advisor, ANG; Mrs. Lynn (Shirley) Alexander; and MG Richard Miller, President of NGAUS were the guest speakers for the conference

One hundred voting delegates and 11 Executive Board members constituted the voting power for the conference. A wonderful time was had by all present for this the first conference outside of the continental United States.

## 1979

The Sixth Annual Conference was called to order at the Hyatt Regency in Phoenix, Arizona, on September 10, 1979 by President Lois Goodson, Ohio. Twenty-one states with charters were in attendance and five states without charters were represented. Wisconsin Auxiliary received its charter; it was charter state number 25.

The State of Mississippi presented the Auxiliary with an American flag and District Two of Iowa presented the Auxiliary with an Auxiliary banner, which was handmade by Marilyn Freking.

The membership had decreased and the total was 1,137.

Guest speakers for this conference were Bryce Hendricks, President of EANGUS; General McCadden, President of NGAUS and the Adjutant General of the State of Virginia; Major General James C. Clem, Adjutant General of the State of Ohio.

The President's award, which became known as the "AR" award was based upon the theme "Auxiliary Rush for '79". The criterion for this award was a point system for communication, reports, and membership increase. Ohio was the winner. The first runner-up was Iowa; second was Mississippi; Missouri was third; and Nebraska was the fourth. President Goodson presented a certificate of appreciation to Marilyn Freking for making the Auxiliary Flag.

Sara Hendricks, scholarship committee chairman announced the scholarship recipients: Risa Lewis, TN; Steven Placzek, NE; Roger Nordahl, MT; Karrie Hendricks, IA; and Kim Poulsen, MD. Ruth Zelnik, OH was the first runner-up.

President Goodson announced that there would be a membership award for an increase in membership. The squash blossom necklace and matching earrings were won by Sondra Monastra of Ohio; second place was a silver and turquoise bracelet won by Clyde Caselton of Iowa and a ring won by Evelyn A. Pedro, Massachusetts. Two thousand tickets were sold for this project and it was the biggest money making project the Auxiliary had had to date.

President Lois Goodson, Ohio, called the Seventh Annual EANGUS Auxiliary Conference to order at the Marc Plaza Hotel in Milwaukee, Wisconsin on September 15, 1980. The total membership stood at 1,395 as of June 30, 1980.

The ways and means project for the year was a grandmother clock. A profit of \$1,653.53 was made.

The winners of the scholarships were: Thomas Workentine, SD; Diane Leadbetter, OH; Sandra Mahoney, MT; Genel Lee, NC; and Kim Poulsen, MD. The scholarship committee recommended that a person be allowed to win only once. This recommendation was ratified. A special scholarship of \$150 was given by Dick and Phyllis O'Brien in memory of their son, John. Sharon Placzek, NE, was the recipient of this one-time scholarship.

The election of officers for the 1980-1982 term was held. The ways and means project was a week at Opryland or \$800.00 cash.

Lois Goodson, Scholarship Chairman, announced the scholarship winners: Janet Sessums, MS; Rachelle Dyess, MS; Vicki Lynn Welsh, MS; Rhonda Dyess, MS; and Martha Mae Nigohosian, MA.

South Dakota and Mississippi tied for the membership/trivia awards. The motto, "Side by Side We Stand With Pride", was won by Missouri. A special award was presented by Secretary Nancy McDowell to Elsie Featherson of Maine. She was named the Queen of the 1981 Conference and was presented with a charm bracelet.

The Ninth Annual EANGUS Auxiliary Conference was called to order by President Sara Hendricks, Iowa, at the Opryland Hotel, Nashville, Tennessee, on September 6, 1982. There were 23 chartered states in attendance and seven states present but not chartered. The total membership as of June 30, 1982 was 1,194.

The election of officers for the term of 1982-1984 was held. Officers elected were: President-Delores Ford, Vice President-Jo Delia, Secretary-Nancy McDowell, and Treasurer-Virginia Ericson.

President Hendricks acknowledged that Virgil and Doris Williams were not present at this conference, and on the last morning of the Conference the assembly was told that Virgil had died the evening before.

The five scholarship winners were all from the State of Mississippi. They were: John Michael Cravens, Kimberly Ann Murphy, Jimmie L. Roush, Leslie Carroll Crawford, and Clarence Eugene Hauk. The alternate was Richard Mark McClaim, Montana.

The Thirteenth Annual Auxiliary Conference was held at the Boston Park Plaza Hotel, Boston, Massachusetts, August 7-9, 1986 with President Nancy McDowell presiding. There were 32 chartered states in attendance and three states present but not chartered. The total membership as of June 30, 1986, was 1,574 annual members and 133 life members for a grand total of 1,707. This was an increase of 82 members over the previous year.

EANGUS President Nate Monastra announced a new award to be presented to Auxiliary members. It was "The Pen is Mightier than the Musket Award". The criteria for this award is based upon a member's outstanding activity in regard to legislative matters pertaining to the National Guard and Reserves. This would include letters written to Congress and a member's leadership at state level in organizing letter-writing campaigns. The first recipient of this award was Doris Williams of Mississippi.

Annis Davis, Legislative Chairman, reported that the Auxiliary had written letters in support of the commemorative stamp for the National Guard, the Civil Service Pension Reform Legislation, and the increase in the Servicemen's Group Life Insurance Program benefits. The Auxiliary was currently writing letters in support of the passage of the Commissary Bill. A Mail Gram Program would be started soon.

#### 1987

The Fourteenth Annual Conference was called to order by President Nancy McDowell of Ohio, in the Cochran

Room of the Galt House Hotel, Louisville, Kentucky on September 21, 1987. There were 37 chartered states in attendance and the states of Alaska, South Carolina, Connecticut and Texas were present but not chartered. The total membership as of June 30, 1987, was 1,576 annual members and 152 life members for a grand total of 1,728. This was an increase of 21 members from the previous year.

Lois Goodson of Ohio received the second annual "The Pen is Mightier than the Musket Award" presented by EANGUS.

Barbara Sheppard, Legislative Chairman, reported that in the past year the Auxiliary had written letters in support of the Commissary Bill, OMB 1988 Budget Proposal, the New GI Bill, tax withholding, overseas training of the National Guard, Amendment of Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and Amendment of US Code to require advancement of Army and Air Force Reserve enlisted personnel to highest grade satisfactorily held after 30 years of service.

"National associate memberships may be issued to individuals who support the objectives of the

An associate member must be an associate member of their state auxiliary if that state is chartered. An associate member shall not be a voting delegate or hold office in the Auxiliary."

The second change was:

ADD: ARTICLE VIII, Section A and C:

- "9. Membership Committee
  - a. The Membership Committee shall consist of a chairperson appointed by the President, plus one member to cover Areas I and II, one to cover Area III, one to cover Areas IV and VI, and one to cover Areas V and VII.
  - b. The Committee shall:
    - 1. correspond with President and Area Directors in the respective states of responsibility, to obtain names of new Auxiliary members and to write letters of welcome to each new member.
- 2. promote communication across the states, offer encouragement and assistance where needed." President Marr presented the following awards:

ARTICLE III, Section B. <u>QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR MEMBERSHIP:</u> 2. LIFE: "An annual member may become a life member by payment of an amount approved by the membership, in addition to the annual dues which apply until the applicant reaches the age of 60. This is a non-refundable payment. After age 60, no dues are required. Application must be accompanied by verification of eligibility by the treasurer of the state of which the applicant is an annual member."

The second change dealt with changing the language regarding representation at conferences. The constitution previously authorized each state to have 6 delegates or proxies for voting purposes at conference. The new language reads:

ARTICLE IX, Section D. REPRESENTATION: 1. Representation at a General or Special Conference of the Auxiliary shall be by chartered state. The number of state delegates apportioned to and accredited annually by each chartered state shall be as follows: a. chartered states with 1 (one) - 5 (five) members shall have a number of delegates equal to their membership number; b. chartered states with 6 (six) - 50 (fifty) members shall have six (6) delegates, plus 1 (one) additional delegate for each additional 50 (fifty) members. 2. Each chartered state shall be entitled to one alternate per authorized delegate. Alternate(s) may be seated as delegate(s) in case(s) of personal and/or professional emergencies that prevent regular delegate(s) from being present at one or more sessions of the conference. 3. In the event that a state does not have alternates attending the conference affected, that state shall be authorized to vote by proxy. To exercise the privilege of voting by proxy, a state must have a minimum of 1 (one) delegate in attendance at the conference affected. Proxies: a. may replace delegates who cannot attend the conference in the case of a personal and/or professional emergency; b. may replace delegates in attendance at the conference who must leave the conference in the case of a personal and/or professional emergency; c. shall be validated by the Credentials and Rules Committee prior to the opening of each session of the conference affected; d. shall be cast by the chairperson of the state delegation. 4. Delegates, alternates, and proxies: a. must be members in good standing as of 31 December of the year preceding the conference affected; b. must be annual or life members of the state they represent; c. must be submitted in writing by the chairperson of the state delegation to the Credentials and Rules Committee prior to the opening session of the conference affected; d. shall be validated by the Credentials and Rules Committee prior to the opening of each session of the conference affected. (In addition, existing subsections 3, 4, 5, 6 were renumbered to 5, 6, 7, 8).

The third change revised Article III 3.2(d) to read: "National Associate membership may be issued to individuals who support the objectives of the AUXILIARY, but are not otherwise qualified for annual or life membership in the ENLISTED ASSOCIATION OF THE NATIONAL GUARD OF THE UNITED STATES or the AUXILIARY. A national associate member shall not be: a voting delegate, eligible for scholarships; or qualified to hold office in the AUXILIARY." The fourth change revised Article III 3.2 (c) to read: "The Executive Council may, by majority vote, confer honorary membership on a person who has rendered outstanding service to the United States, any political subdivision thereof, or the AUXILIARY. Honorary members shall not be: a voting delegate; eligible for scholarships; or qualified to hold office in the AUXILIARY."

Rah! Rochester!"

Saturday events included an EANGUS Executive Council Meeting, which the EANGUS Auxiliary President attended; Exhibitors' Reception; and the EANGUS Auxiliary Past Presidents Social.

"The Mount Rushmore State" members welcomed EANGUS, Auxiliary, exhibitors, guests, and families with warm weather and warm hospitality. Trivia aficionados might know that South Dakota is also known as "The Sunshine State", "The Coyote State", "The Artesian State", "The Blizzard State", and has also been referred to as "The Land of Plenty" and "The Land of Infinite Variety". Members returned to South Dakota, "Where It All Began", for the Forty-second annual EANGUS/Fortieth annual EANGUS Auxiliary Conference and "Fun at the Falls" August 18-21, 2013. South Dakota boasts many natural and created wonders including Mount Rushmore, Crazy Horse statute, the Corn Palace, Sioux Falls, Devil's Gulch, the Black Hills, the Badlands, and the prairie, grasslands, and farmland covering 90% of the state. The Welcome Night festivities were enjoyed at Falls Park.

Committees and the EANGUS Auxiliary Executive Council met on Monday morning and delegates were credentialed. Tuesday morning caucuses allowed time for discussion of the proposed constitution changes and for election of Area Directors.

Acting President Judy Wood (Alabama) called the meeting to order on Tuesday morning and welcomed members. Chaplain Sherry Blackwell (South Dakota) provided inspirational thoughts and led in prayer. Immediate Past President Taylor (Mississippi) led in the pledge to the flag. Acting President Wood introduced the Executive Council and Past Presidents. The roll call by Secretary Wanda Ryan (Kansas) showed there were eighty-one (81) delegates and forty-three (43) proxies from twenty-six (26) chartered states. Four (4) officers and eight (8) Area Directors answered roll call;

sixteen (16) members and five (5) guests also attended the Tuesday session. Chairman Lorraine Miller gave the **Credentials and Rules Report**. **Charity Bierhaus**, Humana/TRICARE South Region, spoke to members and **EANGUS President John Helbert**, thanked members for their support. The agenda, with changes as necessitated by time and guests' attendance, was approved; the standing rules were adopted; the **minutes** were approved; and the **Treasurer's Report** was filed for the record. The Treasurer's Report indicated a 2013 membership of 1,058 (571 annual members plus 487 active life members) and 388 associate members. The remainder of the time before the luncheon on Tuesday was spent in reading and discussing the **proposed constitution changes**. Acting President Wood welcomed the approximately one hundred individuals who attended the Auxiliary Luncheon. Chaplain Blackwell led the invocation. Immediate Past President Taylor introduced the EANGUS Auxiliary Executive Council and spouses who were present and the EANGUS Executive Council and their guests. While attendees finished the buffet lunch Brooke McLean and Scarlet Bauman gave an overview of the mission of The Air Force Enlisted Village. President John Helbert and Vice-President Doug Simpson presented the **EANGUS Publications Awards** to Area V for *Area V Is Alive* newsletter and to Wisconsin for *Bucky's Auxiliary News* newsletter. Roxie Barwick was the editor for both publications. Awards Chairman Sheila Bandy presented awards: **Outstanding State Awards**—1-25 members, Maryland, 26-75 members, Louisiana, and 76plus members, Mississippi; **Torch Award**, Dorothy Inglese (California); **President's Award**, Roxie Barwick (Wisconsin); **Outstanding Membership Award**, Jackie McKennie (Georgia); **Sara Hendricks Lifetime Membership Award** (presented by Sara), Marlys List (South Dakota). Chaplain Blackwell led the benediction and Acting President Wood made closing remarks.

Wednesday—The proposed **constitution changes** were approved, with a deletion on 3.3 Dues (c). The Executive Council suggested that dues reporting and transmittal language be added to the Standard Operating Procedures and that more thought be given to that language before the change would be finalized. Proposed Changes 1 through 3 dealt with National Associate Life—Proposed Change 1 added National Associate Life as a class of membership (Article III Individual Membership 3.1 Classes of Membership (e) National Associate Life) and necessitated addition of National Associate Life, 3.2 Qualifications and Requirements for Membership (e) National Associate Life The National Associate Life membership may be issued to individuals who support the objectives of the AUXILIARY, but are not eligible for annual or lifetime membership in the AUXILIARY. A National Associate Life member shall not be: a voting delegate, eligible to hold an office, eligible for scholarships, eligible for annual or lifetime membership in the AUXILIARY. Dues, one hundred dollars (\$100.00). Change 4 was amended to delete 3.3 c. The change in 3.3 Dues (a) Prescribed dues, Annual, Life, National Associate and Life National Associate, as set forth by the AUXILIARY, are to be paid to the AUXILIARY Treasurer by the chartered states, accompanied by a complete name and address for each member whose dues are being paid. (b) An Annual. Life, National Associate and Life National Associate membership will be on an anniversary date. All memberships will begin on the first day of the month and end the last day of the month. Change 5 10.1 Fiscal Year The fiscal year of the AUXILIARY commences on the anniversary date to coincide with the ENLISTED ASSOCIATION OF THE NATIONAL GUARD OF THE UNITED STATES fiscal year. Change 6 Article XI Parliamentary Authority to read The Current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, shall serve as the parliamentary authority except where it is in conflict with the Constitution of the AUXILIARY, or with standing or special rules established by a General or Special Conference.

Committee Chairmen reports were given by Dorothy Inglese, State Pins Shadowbox; Sharon Henderson, Burden Bears; Thomas McKennie, Finance; Sondra Monastra, Nominations; Vivian Taylor, Life Membership and Public Relations; Barbara Rains, Legislative; and Marlys List, Scholarships. Chairman Inglese provided a review of the **State Pins Shadowbox project** from its inception and reported that five hundred seventy dollars (\$570.00) was generated from the project for the Auxiliary treasury in 2013. Chairman Henderson noted the following recipients of **Burden Bears** for 2013: Shirley Bogdan (Massachusetts), Sandi Munden (Mississippi), Chuck Kasin (North Dakota), George Vaught (Virginia), Kathie Dell (Iowa), and Shirley Spitz (Wisconsin). Chairman McKennie gave the **Audit Report** and **Finance Committee Recommendations**. The Audit Report indicated that all random samplings of financial records were found to be in order. Treasurer Sower recommended that she be allowed to use **Bill Pay** to facilitate the transfer of money and information from on-line Auxiliary

memberships from the EANGUS Internet site to the respective state Auxiliaries. Committee recommended Conference Book line item in budget be changed from two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) to one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to reflect the actual cost of printing in the event that cost was not covered by fund raising activities or donated. Twenty percent (20%) of funds collected through Life National Associate membership will be directed to support the EANGUS Auxiliary Scholarship Fund. An active ad sales campaign will be established to help cover the cost of printing the conference book and further shore up the general fund. The proposed budget for 2014 was adopted as printed. Chairman Monastra reported the following were elected as Area Directors in their respective caucuses: Area II, Margie Holcomb (Virginia); Area III, Dianne Williams (Georgia); Area IV, Kim Clay (Louisiana); Area V, Angela Kennebeck (Iowa) and Chris Sower (Wisconsin): Area VI. Polly Williams (Utah). These individuals joined those Area Directors on the Executive Council who would serve their second year of the two-year term. Chairman Taylor noted recent deaths changed the Life Membership Report as printed in the conference book. She reported that there were 758 life members: active life members, 476; life members not reported by states, 124; deceased life members, 134; ineligible life members (includes divorced, non-Guard spouse, and requests for removal), 24. Those who had died since conference book report were: Peggy E. (Estes) Gillie (GA), lifetime member number 281, June 05, 2013; Ruth (Hulen) Buescher (MO), lifetime member number 105, December 04, 2012; and Joan (Ebenhack) "Joanie" Foster, August 12, 2013. Phoenix, the capital of Arizona with over 4 million residents, was the host city for the Forty-third annual EANGUS Conference (Forty-first for the EANGUS Auxiliary). The Conference began on Sunday afternoon, August 10 and concluded on Wednesday evening, August 13. Arizona is known for its varied landscape, national parks, desert climate, and the Grand Canyon. Humphrey's Peak is the highest point in the state at 12,637 feet. Sunny days are the norm in Phoenix with around 210 per year and temps in the summer average around 106 degrees. Mixed in with the sun and warm temps, there were some monsoon rains while EANGUS and Auxiliary members were in town.

Immediate Past President Vivian Taylor hosted past presidents at lunch in Networks, Hyatt Hotel, on Saturday and provided door prizes. President Jenny Lainhart and Vice President Judy Wood attended the EANGUS EC Meeting.

Sunday was busy with the usual events: Chapel Service; Ribbon Cutting; Opening Session; Welcome Night. At the Opening Session an Arizona Guard member, in prayer robe, provided a Navajo Blessing with an eagle feather to the four directions of the earth, committing the earth to the holy. The 108th Army Band provided music and SFC Dennis Greenwood sang the national anthem, The Star-Spangled Banner. Major General Michael T. McGuire, the Adjutant General of Arizona, and CMSgt Shane G. Clark, Senior Enlisted Advisor (SEA), Arizona made remarks around the Conference theme "We've Got Your Back". We heard that The National Guard is a proven choice for the war fight, the first choice for homeland/community protection and service, and the enduring choice for partnership building. Attendees learned interesting facts about Arizona and Maricopa County, the fourth largest county in the nation. Arizona, the 48th state, was the last of the contiguous states to be admitted to the Union. It is known for its climate, cactus, canyons, copper, cotton, and citrus. The 10th Command Sergeant Major, Army National Guard (ARNG), CSM Brunk W. Conley shared information about the "67%", noting that 67% of the Guard's numbers are enlisted members with the rank of E-5 and below. The 11th Air National Guard (ANG) Command Chief, CMSgt James W. Hotaling stated that as resources continue to decrease the value of the American Airman increases. In a video, outstanding airmen offered advice: take job seriously, learn everything possible, be a servant leader, do things right the first time, contribute, be proficient, work together/synergize, offer similar service from different backgrounds. The First General Session was called to order by President Jenny Lainhart on Tuesday morning, August 12, 2014 at 9:03 a.m. (MST). Roll Call indicated there were sixty (60) delegates, fifty-seven proxies (57), four (4) officers, eight (8) Area Directors, five (5) members, and thirteen (13) guests present on Tuesday from twenty-eight (28) states. President Lainhart recognized the past presidents in attendance: June O'Dowd (LA), Sara Hendricks (IA/NM), Nancy McDowell (OH), Dorothy Inglese (CA), Shelia Bandy (KY), and Vivian Taylor (MS). She also recognized the officers and Area Directors. The minutes from the 2013 Conference were approved and the Treasurer's Report was given. The Treasurer's Report indicated 30 states reported 528 annual members and 481 active life members for 2014 and 303 associate members. Reports from Pins Shadowbox, Burden Bears, Nominations Committee, Lifetime Membership Committee, Public Relations Committee, and Legislative Committee were given by respective Chairmen or person filling in for Chairmen: Dorothy Inglese, Karen Vicento, Sondra Monastra, Vivian Taylor, and Barbara Rains. Chairman Dorothy Inglese reported that five thousand two hundred twenty-six dollars (\$5,226.00) had been raised with the **Pins Shadowbox** through 2013. Those who wished to nominate someone to receive a Burden Bear were encouraged to submit forms to the Committee by Wednesday morning, August 13, 2014. **The Lifetime Membership Report** indicated there were seven hundred sixty-nine (769) life

members; four hundred sixty-three (463) active life members; one hundred thirty-five (135) life members not reported by states; one hundred forty-six (146) deceased life members; and twenty-five (25) ineligible life members (includes divorced, non-Guard spouse, and requests for removal). Chairman Taylor reported that the Class of 2013 had a total of eight (8) with six (6) ladies and two (2) gentlemen. Through August 12, 2014, there were six (6) members in the Class of 2014. The Ribbon Cutting for the Exhibition, Blood Drive and Bone Marrow Donation and Expo began at 10:00 a.m. The first business session was called to order at 1:00 p.m. and included the posting of colors, *The Star-Spangled Banner*, *The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America*, and an Indiana welcome from Major General Courtney Carr, the Adjutant General of Indiana. A Town Hall Meeting with Chief of the National Guard Bureau (NGB) General Frank J. Grass and NGB Senior Enlisted Adviser (SEA) Chief Master Sergeant (CMSgt) Mitchell O. Brush provided information on the state of the National Guard. Special recognition was given to: NGB SEA CMSgt Mitchell O. Brush; Office of the Secretary of Defense-Reserve Affairs SEA Sergeant Major (SGM) Mike Shultz; Army National Guard (ARNG) Command Sergeant Major (CSM) Brunk W. Conley; Air National Guard (ANG) Command Chief Master Sergeant (CCM); and former and state Senior Enlisted Leaders, ARNG CSMs, ANG CCMs/SEAs, Adjutants Generals, EANGUS Past Presidents, AGAUS, NGAUS, and EANGUS National Office Staff. EANGUS President John Harris introduced the EANGUS Executive Council and EANGUS Auxiliary President Judy Wood introduced the EANGUS Auxiliary Past Presidents and the EANGUS Auxiliary Executive Council. The Welcome Night Function was held at Veterans

Memorial Plaza with barbeque and accompaniments from Big Hoffa's BBQ. The Plaza, once known as Obelisk Square, was completed in 1930. Centrally located in the Plaza the Obelisk and Fountain honor all Indiana veterans.

On Monday, August 10, 2015 EANGUS Auxiliary Committees met in the Indiana Convention Center and the EANGUS Auxiliary Executive Council (EC) met in the President's Suite in the Westin Hotel. Delegates were credentialed by the Credentials Committee. The EC members enjoyed a continental breakfast/brunch with some homemade foods provided by President Judy Wood and Vice President Connie Myers. On Monday afternoon Membership Chairman Dianne Williams and EANGUS' Director of Operations Joan Gardiner shared information about the EANGUS Auxiliary website and membership lists. Monday evening was free and many members shared dinner and entertainment with their states and/or enjoyed the Junior Enlisted event at the Indianapolis Colts Grille.

President Judy P. Wood (AL) called the First General Session to order in the Indiana Convention Center Rooms 137-139 at 9:02 a.m. on Tuesday, August 11, 2015. **Roll call** showed sixty-two (62) delegates, thirty-six (36) proxies, five (5) officers, eight (8) area directors, six (6) guests, and five (5) associate members from twenty-five (25) states. President Wood recognized the past presidents in attendance: Immediate Past President Jenny Lainhart (KY); June O'Dowd (LA); Sara Hendricks (IA/NM); Nancy McDowell (OH); Sheila Bandy (KY); and Vivian Taylor (MS). President Wood also recognized the officers and area directors. Eight (8) first timers were recognized: Laura Snyder (IN); Karen Haynes (KS); Anna Williams (MD); Kim Pierce (MO); Angie Carnes and Charity Jones (MS); Sally VanRiper (PA); and Holly Rouffy (SC).

The minutes from the 2014 Conference were approved and the Treasurer's Report was given. Membership as of December 31, 2014 for the 2015 year as indicated by the Treasurer was: 543 annual members; 460 active life members; and 355 associate members. Committee reports were given from Credentials and Rules, Burden Bears, Constitution, Family Affairs, Finance, History, Legislative, Lifetime Membership, Membership, Nominations, Philanthropic, Public Relations, Scholarship, and Ways and Means. Constitution Committee Chairman Richard Bryant reported there were no constitution issues brought to the floor for the 42nd Annual EANGUS Auxiliary Conference. He further reported that the EC had tasked the Committee with reviewing and revising the current Constitution and rewriting the By-Laws, making that two separate documents as it had been several years in the past. Finance Committee Chairman Thomas McKennie reported that the Finance Committee had reviewed all vouchers and compared them to the associated checks issued and that all were found to be proper. Lifetime membership dues were discussed to find that the amount of dues had increased over the previous year. Two recommendations were made and approved by the body: 1) The verbiage that surrounded the collection of donations for scholarships be changed to read that donations were "mandatory" rather than "suggested" and 2) that the Constitution Committee be allowed to research Constitution and By-Laws and cover any associated cost through the Auxiliary's miscellaneous funds. Legislative Committee Co-Chairman Wanda Verne (FL) moved that "Social Media" be added to the bi-annual and yearly reports due to the introduction of Phone2Action in 2015 and the addition of Facebook and Twitter as tools to contact United States Senators and Representatives. Sheila Bandy (KY) seconded that motion and the motion carried. Lifetime Membership Committee Chairman reported seven hundred eight-one (781) life members, four hundred fifty-eight (458) active life members; one hundred twenty-three (123) life members not reported by states; one hundred seventy-five (175) deceased life members; twenty-five (25) ineligible life members (included divorced, non-Guard spouse, and requests for removal); ten (10) members in the class of 2014; and eight (8) members in the class of 2015 through August 10, 2015. **Membership** Committee Chairman Dianne Williams reported the national life associate membership card distribution from September 2014 to date was: Alabama, 1; Pennsylvania, 1; Arizona, 1; California, 3; Florida, 1; Hawaii, 2; Kentucky, 1; Louisiana, 1; Massachusetts, 1; Mississippi, 7; New Hampshire, 3; South Carolina, 1; Tennessee, 1; Texas, 2; Utah, 1; Virginia, 2; Washington, 1; West Virginia, 5. Nominations Committee Chairman Sondra Monastra reported the following individuals had been elected in area caucuses to serve a two-year term: Area II, Margie Holcomb (VA); Area III, Marie Brabham (FL); Area IV, Kim Clay (LA); Area V, Cathy Berry (WI); Area VI, Polly Williams (UT). Area Directors had not been elected in Areas I and VII. Philanthropic Committee Chairman Carol Benda reported the Committee's revised SOP would be presented to the EC Meeting on Wednesday, August 12, 2015 for approval. The Ronald McDonald House Representative would be present to accept a donation on Wednesday, August 12, 2015. Scholarship Committee Co-Chairman Marlys List announced scholarship recipients: Nathan B. Woolard (IA), three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00), USAA scholarship; Casey J. Grosso (WA), one thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1,250.00); Katie R. Docter (LA), one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00); and Chara J. Barke (ND), one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00). Guests CSM Brunk W. Conley and his wife, Laura; Scott Delveau from the Air Force Enlisted Village; Dick Smith from USAA; Mark Wilson from Grantham University; and Stephen Smith from Grand Canyon University addressed the members. President Judy Wood presented Auxiliary coins to CSM Conley and Laura and Hall of Fame Awards to Air Force Enlisted Village, USAA, Grantham University, Grand Canyon University, and Donovan Jenks (CA). Donovan had donated one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to be used for the Auxiliary Brunch and he had already made another donation of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to be used as needed by the Auxiliary in the coming year. President Wood also presented coins to Delores Edwards (KS), Pat Burchfield (MS), Vivian Taylor (MS), and Debra Campbell (OK) for donations to the Brunch. The **proposed budget** was approved as presented by the membership. The Tuesday evening All Areas Hospitality Night was held at the Military Park.

President Wood called the Second General Session to order on Wednesday, August 12, 2015 at 8:35 a.m. SGM John Roach gave information about the **EANGUS 2016 Conference** to be held in **New Orleans**, **Louisiana**, **August 20-25**, **2016**.

On Wednesday the Roll Call indicated sixty (60) delegates, thirty-eight (38) proxies, five (5) officers, eight (8) area directors, seven (7) members, four (4) guests, and eight (8) associate members. Philanthropic Chairman Carol Benda, Indiana Auxiliary President Laura Snyder, and President Judy Wood presented a donation of three hundred thirty dollars (\$330.00) to The Ronald McDonald House (RMH) Representative, Keri Brantley, Director of Development for the RMH of Indiana. Ms. Brantley stated that fifty-two (52) families per night from numerous states and overseas were served at the local RMH. She expressed appreciation for the monetary donation and for the donated toiletries provided by members. EANGUS Publications Chairman Andy Strauss (CA) presented the plaques for 2014 to Area V Is Alive!, Area V Auxiliary newsletter, and Dogwood Blossom, Virginia Auxiliary newsletter. For 2015 there was a tie between Wisconsin Auxiliary's Bucky's Auxiliary News and South Dakota Auxiliary's Dakota Messenger. There was an overlooked area submission so that plaque would be forthcoming—Area V Is Alive! won back-to-back. [Chairman Strauss later told EANGUS Auxiliary Area IV Director Monica Williams that he should have announced that winner as Area IV's newsletter The Voice of Area IV. That was also reported on the Publications report submitted to EANGUS.] Burden Bears Committee Co-Chairman Karen Vicento reported that Burden Bears were presented to: Greg Gilroy (KS); Major General Tim Orr (TAG, IA); Kathie Dell (IA); Judy Smith (KS); Pamela Haworth (grandson "Super B", KS); Shelli Kasin (ND); and Irene Pinter (PA). Philanthropic Committee Chairman Carol Benda reported that six hundred sixty dollars was disbursed equally to the RMH in Indianapolis and the Fisher House (FH) as per the vote of the body in 2014. The FH was located at the VA Hospital in Hines, Illinois. Both the RMH and FH locations were in Area V and were chosen by the Philanthropic Committee and Host State Conference Chair, Indiana Auxiliary President Laura Snyder.

[It was confirmed on August 26, 2015 that Barbara Sheppard had not died; Past President Sheila Bandy had a conversation with Barbara on that date.] Chaplain Brookins provided thoughts on God's limitless, abundant grace and read II Corinthians 12:9, 10. She sang a spiritual to conclude the memorial service.

**President's Comments**—President Judy Wood expressed thanks to The EANGUS Auxiliary Executive Council, Conference Coordinator Sheila Bandy, Sergeants at Arms Jackye Hargrove (AL) and Billie Mapes (TN), Indiana Auxiliary President Laura Snyder, and the delegates, members, associate members, and guests. President Wood recognized three EANGUS Past Presidents who were in the chambers: Frank Lever, Nate Monastra, and Bryce Hendricks.

The Second General Session adjourned, sine die, at 11:24 a.m. on Wednesday, August 12, 2015. The EANGUS Auxiliary EC met in the President's Suite in the Westin Hotel. Plans for the 2016 Conference in New Orleans, Louisiana were discussed. President Wood stated she would review volunteer forms and make Committee appointments within thirty days. EC members discussed membership issues and reviewed scheduling that might be adjusted to maximize members' participation at Conference.

## 2016

The *Big Easy*, NOLA—New Orleans (pronounced New OAR-linz), Louisiana (La Nouvelle Orleans in French)—hosted EANGUS and Auxiliary members, families, and guests for the 45<sup>th</sup> annual EANGUS Conference/43<sup>rd</sup> EANGUS Auxiliary Conference August 21-24, 2016. The conference theme was "Make It Your New Orleans" and it seemed that the Louisiana National Guard Enlisted Association (LANGEA) and Auxiliary wanted to "laissez les bon temps rouler" (let the good times roll), even when faced with tremendous challenges. The city, situated in southeastern Louisiana, straddles the Mississippi River and it is continuing to recover from the devastation of Hurricane Katrina in August 2005 when the Federal levee system failed and New Orleans was inundated with water, flooding 80% of the city; the Lower Ninth Ward was reflooded by Hurricane Rita in September 2005. New Orleans lost almost half its population following the destruction of homes and neighborhoods. New Orleans, though distressed during these years, is still well known for its vitality and party atmosphere. World-famous for its cuisine and music, New Orleans is also renowned for its celebrations and festivals, especially Mardi Gras, which dates back to French colonial times. French and Spanish Creole architecture, as well as its cross-cultural and multilingual heritage, are also highlights of this city. In the weeks preceding the Conference Mother Nature again presented a challenge to the folks of Louisiana in the form of historic rains which flooded areas, especially around the state capital area, and required the efforts of Louisiana's National Guard soldiers and airmen. Conference attendees pitched in where they were needed to complete tasks that would have been done by Louisiana members. In three days over eighty-

EANGUS Auxiliary Past President Vivian Taylor served as hostess for the Past Presidents Social in Drago's Restaurant and provided door prizes. EANGUS Auxiliary Silent Auction Chairman Paula Carrigan and her Mississippi Auxiliary helpers accomplished the set-up of the EANGUS Auxiliary Silent Auction. Sunday began with EANGUS Area Caucuses and continued with Chapel Service conducted by Bryce Hendricks (IA/NM), First-Timers Meetings, and Ribbon Cutting for the Exhibition Hall.

The **Treasurer's report** was filed for the record. **Membership** from thirty (30) reporting states on December 31, 2015 stood at six hundred eighty-five (685) annual members, four hundred sixty-six (466) active lifetime members for a total of one thousand one hundred fifty-one (1,151) members; there were three hundred (341) annual associate members. On July 31, 2016 there were forty-three (43) EANGUS Auxiliary life associate members. **Constitution** Committee Chairman Richard Bryant reported no issues to be brought before the body at the 43<sup>rd</sup> EANGUS Auxiliary Conference. The review and possible rewrite of the Constitution and Bylaws would be a longer process than originally thought and would need to continue through the next year. **Finance** Committee Chairman Thomas McKennie reported that the Finance Committee had met and reviewed all vouchers and associated checks issued and found that all were in order. **History** Committee Chairman Vivian Taylor reported sixteen (16) states—Alabama, Arkansas, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, New Mexico, North Dakota, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, and Wisconsin—provided history highlights for the 2015 year and those highlights were included in the 2016 Conference Book. **Legislative** Committee Chairman Deanna Myers reported the Legislative Committee would need to update the Legislative SOP. The 46<sup>th</sup> EANGUS annual conference and 44<sup>th</sup> annual EANGUS Auxiliary conference was held August 27-30, 2017 in Reno, Nevada, known as "The Biggest Little City in the World". The city is named after Jesse L. Reno, a United States Army officer who served in the Mexican-American War, the Utah War, the western frontier, and as a Union General during the American Civil War. Reno sits in a high desert at the foot of the Sierra Nevada and its downtown area (along with Sparks) occupies a valley informally known as the Truckee Meadows.

Those traveling by plane were, in some cases, delayed by the airlines due to the effects of Hurricane Harvey which made landfall on the Central Texas Coast (Corpus Christi/Houston/Rockport area). EANGUS and EANGUS Auxiliary gave and/or pledged several thousand dollars for EANGUS "We Care for America" Foundation to provide relief to Texas National Guard members affected by Hurricane Harvey.

Folks who drove in to Reno saw sights such as the Grand Canyon; Yellowstone National Park; the Continental Divide; the Solar Eclipse in Casper, Wyoming; Lake Tahoe; Lake Mead and the Hoover Dam; Hawthorne Army Ammo Depot (World's Largest Depot); the very blue waters of Walker Lake; Fallon Naval Air Station (the premier tactical air warfare training center where an entire carrier air wing can conduct comprehensive training); Creech and Nellis Air Force Bases; Historic Route 66; mesas, buttes, plateaus; painted desert; Chisholm Trail; and so much more. A Faces of Freedom 18-wheel truck was observed several times with faces of servicemen from World War II, Vietnam, Gulf War, and Global War on Terror.

**Membership for the 2017 year** was 524 annual members, 454 active lifetime members, and 331 annual associate members. EANGUS Auxiliary Area II Director Margie Holcomb shared with the attendees her journey in the Virginia and Area II Auxiliary. EANGUS staff members dropped in to acknowledge the Auxiliary and Command Chief Master Sergeant (R) Dick Smith and Josie Quintana, USAA and Donovan Jenks (CA) addressed the members. A Buffet Brunch, provided by USAA, was served. EANGUS Scholarship Chairman Ronald E. "Ronnie" Emerson noted 176 scholarship applications

had been received for the various EANGUS and partner scholarships which was a 54% increase from the previous year. The Virginia Military Institute had ranked the applicants. EANGUS and partner scholarships were presented on Wednesday evening at the Banquet and Awards Program. The Agenda and Standing Rules were adopted. Minutes were approved as printed in the Conference Book. The Treasurer's Report was printed in the Conference Book; it was accepted and filed for the record. A Balance Sheet was provided that indicated the ending balance in the EANGUS Auxiliary checking account (only account) on May 31, 2017 was eighty-six thousand five hundred thirty-nine dollars sixty-six cents (\$86,539.66). Burden Bears Committee and Constitution Committee reports were given. The body approved one EANGUS Auxiliary Constitution Amendment: under Article V Officers, 5.2 Duties and Powers d TREASURER 6. the following was added as the last sentence...The Treasurer be required to have the approval of the Executive Council for expenditures of funds in excess of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). Continuity Committee, Family Affairs Committee, and Finance Committee provided reports. The Proposed Budget was adopted as printed—Income, twenty-six thousand nine hundred fifty dollars (\$26,950.00); Expenditures, thirty-five thousand three hundred fifty dollars (\$35,350.00); less Reserve Funds, eight thousand four hundred dollars (\$8,400.00). The actual income for 2016 was twenty-five thousand five hundred seventy-eight dollars thirty-two cents (\$25,578.32). The Finance Committee conducted an Audit of the records from Cora Sower, Treasurer – outgoing, and found them to be in order. History Committee, Legislative Committee, and Lifetime Membership Committee reports were presented. History Committee and Lifetime Membership Committee Chairman Vivian D. Taylor referred members to the printed reports in the Conference Book. A copy of the document, History Highlights from the States, was provided to each state delegation and was posted on eangusauxiliary.org. Legislative Committee Chairman Barbara Rains reported on her activities as Committee Chairman since 2016 Conference and the contacts made by areas: Area I—none; Area II—five emails, 2 responses; Area III—thirty-one emails, eleven responses; Area IV—one hundred fifty-seven emails, six visits/social, ninety-nine responses; Area V—forty-four letters, one hundred four emails, twenty-five phone calls, one hundred twenty-five visits/social; Area VI—none; Area VII—none.
