David Dan Hart, age 76, former president of the Mississippi National Guard Noncommissioned Officers Association, passed away Sunday, April 19, 2020 at his home surrounded by his family. A memorial service will be held at a later date. Ott & Lee Funeral Home in Brandon, MS is handling arrangements.

Mr. Hart, a Pickens native, served in the Mississippi National Guard from March 1964 until his retirement in September 1994. He served in numerous positions culminating as the Mississippi Air National Guard's State Command Chief Master Sergeant. He received numerous awards and decorations. Mr. Hart served in various positions in the Mississippi National Guard Noncommissioned Officers Association and as its President, 1986-1987. 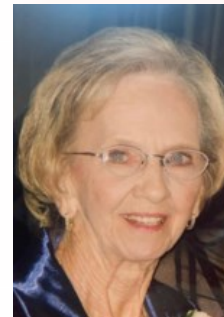
She is preceded in death by her parents, Clifton "Buck" Gartee, Jr. and Lessie Ross Gartee, and sister, Kathryn Lawalin.

Mississippi Auxiliary—History Highlights for 2019

State Conference—The Mississippi National Guard Noncommissioned Officers (MS NG NCO) Association and Auxiliary met for annual Conference April 12-14, 2019 at the Hilton Hotel in Jackson, Mississippi. The Conference was a celebration of 50 years of the MS NG NCO Association (1969-2019). Many MS NG NCO Association Past Presidents were in attendance, some who had not been at Conference for a number of years, and they were recognized at the joint session on Saturday morning. The Mississippi Auxiliary Past Presidents in attendance were also recognized during the joint session. The Conference included the standard events—golfing, fishing, bowling, hospitality rooms, Friday night catfish/chicken meal, Saturday morning Retiree Breakfast, business sessions and break outs, Awards Banquet, Sunday morning chapel service, etc. The planned corn hole tournament was cancelled.

There were no eligible recipients for the 2019 Auxiliary scholarships. Also on Saturday afternoon, Tony L. Boyles and Mississippi Senior Enlisted Leader CSM John Raines, III announced the winners of the competition who were NCO of the Year, SGT Darrell Washington and Airman, A1C Trung Nguyen. Auxiliary President Angie Carnes presented the Auxiliary President’s Award to Secretary Vivian Taylor and the Auxiliary’s *Side by Side* Award to Chance Netto.

Area IV Mid-Winter Caucus—EANGUS Auxiliary Area IV Treasurer and Mississippi Auxiliary Past President and Past Treasurer Paula Carrigan, EANGUS Auxiliary and Mississippi Auxiliary Immediate Past President Connie Myers, EANGUS Auxiliary Area IV and Mississippi Auxiliary Secretary and Mississippi Auxiliary Past President Vivian Taylor, and EANGUS Auxiliary and Mississippi Auxiliary associate lifetime member Jerry Taylor represented the Mississippi Auxiliary at the Auxiliary Caucus on Saturday morning January 19.
